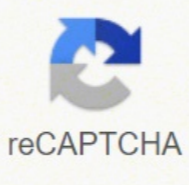


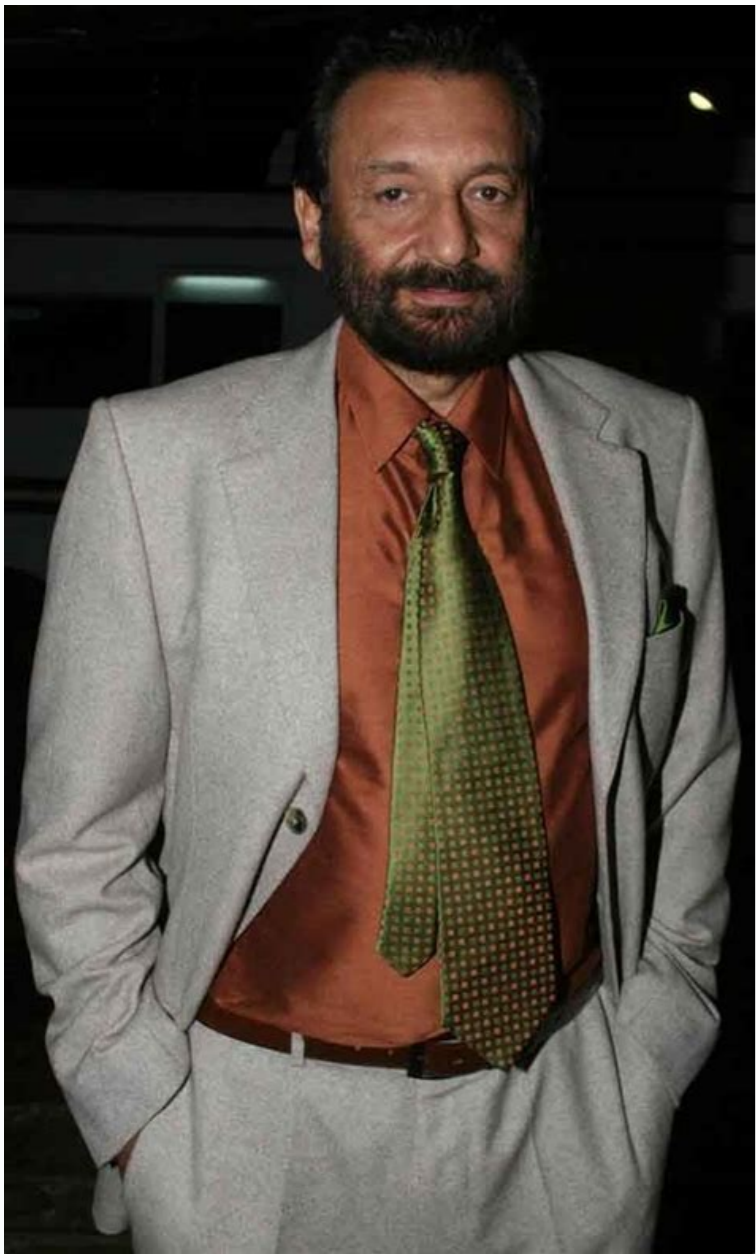

The music was composed by Ustad Nusrat Fateh Ali Khan. The film won the National Film Award for Best Film in Hindi, Filmfare Critics Award for Best Film and Best Direction for that year. The film was premiered at the 1994 Cannes Film Festival, and was screened at the Edinburgh Film Festival. [3][4] The film was selected as the Indian entry for Best Foreign Language Film at the 67th Academy Awards, but was not accepted as a nominee. [5] Plot The film opens in the summer of 1968 in a small village in Uttar Pradesh. [6] Phoolan is married to a twenty-nine-year-old named Putilal (Aditya Shrivastava). Although child marriages were customary during that period, Phoolan Moola's mother (Savitri Raekwar) objects at the time of the match. Phoolan Deviden's older father (Ram Charan Nirmalkar) conforming to his culture, unfortunately disagrees, and He was sent away with Putilal. Shri Ram returns to his gang While Vikram receives him with respect, Shri Ram follows Vikram's egalitarian leadership style and craves Phoolan. During this time, Phoolan returns to her husband Putilal and, with Vikram's help, kidnaps him and demands justice for the rape and abuse, beating him. In August 1980, Shri Ram organized the assassination of Vikram and abducted Phoolan, taking her to the village of Behmai. Phoolan is repeatedly raped and beaten by Shri Ram and other gang members, as punishment for her "disrespect" for her previous advances and for her audacity to catch up. The startling and disturbing humiliation and final punishment is that she is stripped, paraded around Behmai, beaten and sent to fetch water from the well (in full view of the village). A severely traumatized Phoolan returns to her cousin Kailash. He gradually recovers and goes in search of Man Singh (Manoj Bajpai), an old friend of Vikram Mallah. Man Singh takes her to another big band, led by Baba Mustakim (Rajesh Vivek). He tells his story to Baba and asks him for men and weapons to form a gang. Baba Mustakim agrees, and Man Singh and Phoolan become the leaders of the new band. Phoolan leads his new gang with courage, generosity, humility and cunning. His escort and legend grow. She becomes known as Phoolan Devi, the queen of bandits. In February 1991, Baba Mustakim informs her of a big wedding in Behmai, with Thakur Shri Ram present. When Phoolan leaves, Baba Mustakim warns her to stay low. Pholan attacks the wedding party and his gang takes revenge on Behmai's entire Thakur clan. They round up the men and beat them. Many of the men were killed. This act of revenge brings her to the attention of national law enforcement (in New Delhi). Senior police officers now start a massive manhunt for Phoolan, and Thakur RAM takes the opportunity to come to their rescue. Mala remained faithful to the directors, never spoke publicly against the film, claiming that he wason many sources. She remained close to Devi in the following years, when the former outlaw suffered atThe transformation, becoming an Indian MP in 1996, and remained in contact until the assassination of Devi in 2001.[2] Critical welcome The film has a rating of approval of Rotten Tomatoes of 100% based on 25 reviews, with an average score of 7.58/10.[13] Jonathan Rosenbaum called it "a film that fills the eyes and often exciting..." writing that "at its best, remembers the radical westerners of the third world He writes, however, that the film "despite his ambition, his fierce anger and his visual style... remains much below these points of reference because of its sensational accumulation and quite indiscriminate with horrors and violence, which eventually becomes pornographic. The edition is not what really happened to Phoolan Devi... The problem is the tendency of the film to desensitize us with an excess of detail." [14] James Berardinelli gave the film 3.5 out of 4, writing that "the picture of indignity and human suffering painted by Bandito Queen is equal to that of Schindler's List. As the Nazis treated Jews as animals, so also the superior caste Indians consider the births in misery and squalor. » «Trascinato, written with force and well-recited», writes, «Bandit Queen is a top-notch adventure film." [15] Edward Guthmann of the San Francisco Chronicle gave the film 3 stars out of 4 and defined it as "a fascinating and passionate film" and praised Biswa's performance, calling it "the fireball of the implacable, glowing fury -- a slap to his country and his barbaric antiquated treatment of women." He notes that the film "does not claim to be objective. Kapur is clearly indignant for the prejudices of gender and caste of his country." [16] This lack of objectivity is contrasted by Richard Corliss, whohe called "an exciting film that brings life to the story of Devi with passion but without expressing reviews."
