A resume review service enables you to get your resume looked over by a resume professional. They will offer you detailed suggestions on how you can improve it and better tailor it to the jobs you're applying for. A professional resume review will usually include the following: Suggestions to help you quantify your achievements Advice on what areas/skills/achievements to focus more/less on Suggestions on how to optimize for your target role or company Ideas on how you can stand out if you're in a very competitive field Corrections on spelling or grammar mistakes How to improve formatting, style, and tone. Advice on making your resume the right length Applicant tracking system (ATS) keyword and formatting compatibility "From my experience, even highly qualified candidates often struggle to articulate their skills, achievements, and potential impact in a concise and compelling way. Resume reviews are incredibly valuable because they provide an objective perspective on how your professional story is being communicated." Alexandre, resume and interview coach. With some resume review services, you upload your resume to their site and then receive written feedback on your resume usually within a few hours. Many of these are free, as the hope is that you'll then buy a resume-writing package. However, there are some resume review services where you get your resume feedback in person, as part of a 1-hour feedback session. This allows for a deeper, two-way conversation about what you want to achieve with the resume and how to do it. 1.1 Resume Review vs. Resume Writing Many people don't understand the difference between these services, and a Google search for term each brings almost identical results. It shouldn't, because resume review services and resume writing services serve distinct needs: Resume Review Services: These focus on evaluating and enhancing your existing resume. With a resume review service, you submit your self-crafted resume, and the experts provide detailed feedback, suggesting improvements to fine-tune your document for success. "A resume review helps highlight key accomplishments, eliminate unnecessary details, and align the document with industry-specific expectations. It can uncover blind spots, like missed opportunities to quantify results or highlight leadership roles, and help build a narrative that aligns with your career goals." Resume Writing Services: You provide them with your career history, accomplishments, and any relevant information, and they create a resume from scratch for you. These services are for people who want a professional-looking resume without the hassle of doing it themselves. As you'd expect, this comes with a higher cost - for a quality result you'll need to pay upwards of \$500. For more budget services, expect a more generic end result that is less accurately tailored to your needs. You'll need to make your own decision, but we believe that a resume review is usually a better option, for the following reasons: as you're also putting some work in, it's a less expensive route to a strong resume you end up with a resume that is 100% unique you actually learn how to create a strong resume, so next time you won't need help If you're still set on a resume writing service, then our recommendation would be Executive Drafts, as they have a lot of positive reviews on Reddit and other platforms, and have reasonable pricing options (we have no affiliation). 2. How much do resume review services cost? The price of resume services can vary significantly, depending on the type of service you choose and the level of expertise you're looking for. Here's a breakdown of the typical costs you can expect: Resume Review Services: These services, which focus on evaluating and improving your existing resume, are often the more budget-friendly option. Prices range from \$0 to ~\$550, as you'll see in the list below. The price generally reflects the expertise of the person reviewing your resume, the time they spend on it, and how much two-way feedback is offered. Resume Writing Services: If you opt for a resume writing service, where professionals create a new resume from scratch, the cost tends to be higher. On average, you can expect to pay anywhere from \$100 to \$1000, depending on the complexity of your career history and the expertise of the writer. Additional Services: Some resume service providers offer add-on services, such as cover letter writing, LinkedIn profile optimization, or job interview coaching. Seven best resume review services in 2025 One surprising thing we discovered is that there aren't actually that many good resume review services available. The resume market seems to be completely dominated by the resume writing services, which have their place but, as mentioned above, serve a different need. To find good resume review services you'll have to sift through a lot of resume writing services, and it can be hard to get lost in the noise. That's why we created this list. Let's take a look. #1. IGotAnOffer (Best if you're applying to top companies or competitive roles) Pricing: \$149 for a 1-hour resume review session. Format: 1-to-1 video call Reviews: 5.0 on Google, 4.96 rating on own site. Reviewer expertise: All resume coaches have been recruiters/interviewers at top companies (Google, McKinsey, etc) Satisfaction guarantee: 100% refund if you're not satisfied. On IGotAnOffer you can book a 1h resume review session with resume coaches who have worked as recruiters or interviewers at top companies. It specializes in Tech, Consulting, and Finance, so if you're targeting a role in one of these industries, it's exactly what you need. You can search by company, role, specialty, timezone, etc, and book a timeslot that suits you. There are over 300 resume coaches on the platform, all vetted and highly qualified, so plenty to choose from. Of course, \$149 is still a significant investment so if you're going for a lower-paid or non-competitive role, you might prefer to try options 2 or 3 below. #2. R/resume thread on Reddit (Best place for a free resume review) Pricing: Free Format: online forum Reviews: not applicable Reviewer expertise: Varies Satisfaction guarantee: not applicable It's technically not a resume "service". But if you want to get some different opinions on your resume without spending money, this resumes page on Reddit is a very useful place to go. Post it there (you may want to anonymize it first) and after a day or so you should have a few comments giving you ideas on how to improve it. Of course, it's hard to tell if the people commenting really know what they're talking about, and sometimes the criticism could do with a bit more sugar-coating (!), but hey, it's free. Plus, you can gain a few tips and insights by browsing other people's resumes and the comments on those. #3. TopResume (Best for including an ATS checker) Pricing: Free Format: Emailed feedback Reviews: 4.1 on TrustPilot Reviewer expertise: Low Satisfaction guarantee: not applicable As part of my research for this article, I tried some of the free resume review sites that seemed to be frequently recommended: ExecutiveDraft, TopResume, and Resume Worded. While ResumeWorded uses 100% AI to give you an instant rating with feedback that is too generic to be very useful, I was impressed by both ExecutiveDraft and TopResume. Both came back within a few hours with some useful pointers that would have helped me take my resume from "weak" to "fair". I've selected TopResume as the pick of the bunch because it gives the most detailed feedback breakdown and includes a ATS check which was interesting. Is a free resume review from TopResume or anyone else going to help you generate a truly excellent resume? No, of course not. Nothing that valuable comes for free! Satisfaction guarantee: Yes, 80% or 50% refund depending on when you ask for it. The Muse is a very well-established site offering a wide range of services including resume coaching. The Muse gets generally good reviews and we've included it as #2 on this list because its coaches are properly vetted and have real expertise. A browse of the resume coaches available reveals that many specialize in working with students or new graduates. We also like that you can look through coaches' profiles and reviews, and choose the one that best matches your requirements. It's not super cheap, as you'd probably want to go for at least the \$259 option to get enough talking time and 2 rounds of edits, but you can be pretty confident of a good outcome. #5. LinkedIn Resume coaches (Best for accommodating a wide range of needs) Pricing: Huge variation, usually on request. Format: Usually 1-to-1 video call but can vary Reviews: Depends on which resume coach you choose Reviewer expertise: Varies Satisfaction guarantee: No You probably don't think of LinkedIn as somewhere to go to when you're looking to buy a service. And in many ways, it's not very well set up for this. You have to message a coach rather than book them immediately, prices are often only available on request, etc. In other words, it's not a great user experience. However, it's worth including in this list as a useful option due to the sheer range of recruiters, hiring managers, and resume coaches that you can get in touch with. Whatever industry, role, and location you're looking for, LinkedIn has pretty much got you covered. (Tip: Add 'resume review' as a skill in the search bar to get people who will review your resume rather than offer to write it from scratch) #6. MentorCruise (Best if you want a long-term resume /career mentor) Pricing: Starts at \$79 per 30 min session Format: 1-to-1 video call Reviews: 4.6 on TrustPilot Reviewer expertise: Good quality, vetted resume coaches. Satisfaction guarantee: No There are some good resume coaches available on Mentor Cruise and at \$79 for a 30-minute session, it's a good option if you're looking for some quick expert feedback without spending too much. You can find coaches or "mentors" from a large range of top companies - Amazon, Zalando, DoorDash, to name a few - though bear in mind that the more prestigious the companies they've worked for, the more your mentor is likely to charge. MentorCruise is set up as a longer-term, mentoring service. The idea is that you pay monthly for the right to a number of calls and communications with your coach/mentor. If that's what you're looking for, it's a solid option. If you're just looking for a one-off resume review, you can still do that too but the UX is a bit clunky and it can be hard to find exactly what you're looking for. #7. Huntr (Best AI resume builder) Pricing: Free and paid plans (resume builder included in free tier) Format: AI-powered resume builder, browser-based Reviews: 4.6 on Chrome Web Store (for Huntr extension) Reviewer expertise: Automated tool, no live reviewer Satisfaction guarantee: No Huntr is better known as a job tracker, but its AI resume builder is surprisingly strong—especially if you're already using the platform to manage your job search. It can generate targeted resumes based on the roles you're applying to, using your job tracker data to highlight the most relevant skills and experience. The interface is clean, intuitive, and helps you quickly build and customize resumes for different applications. It's perhaps not as advanced in design flexibility as tools like Teal, but if you're already using Huntr to organize your search, it could make sense to try the resume feature. 4. Which resume services you should AVOID As mentioned above, there is a lot of variation in the resume service market: there are some good services, but there are plenty of poor ones too. A lot of people ask whether the Indeed resume review service is worth using, due to its relatively low price. We would NOT recommend Indeed if you're hoping for a considered, detailed evaluation, as we've seen reports from its reviewers that they get very little time to spend on your resume. In general, be sure to avoid resume services that show any of these red flags: Lack of Transparency: Avoid services that are not transparent about their pricing, processes, or the qualifications of their reviewers or writers. You should know exactly what you're paying for and who will be handling your resume. If not, you risk paying for a resume that's been written by someone completely unqualified. Price is too low. Top-quality individual resume writers usually charge around \$500 per resume or more. So if a site is charging you \$150, you should know that your writer will not be a real expert. Likewise, you can find well-reviewed writers on sites like UpWork for \$35 but don't expect the expertise that would help you get interviews at top companies. Cookie-Cutter Templates: Steer clear of services that rely heavily on generic resume templates. Your resume should be tailored to your unique skills and experiences, not a one-size-fits-all solution. Guaranteed Job Offers: Be cautious of services that promise guaranteed job offers or unrealistic outcomes. Job success depends on various factors, and no service can guarantee employment. Inadequate Customer Support: Avoid services that provide poor or nonexistent customer support. Good communication and responsiveness are crucial, especially if you have questions or concerns. No Revisions: A resume service that doesn't offer revisions or edits is one to avoid. ResumeSpice kept a red flag. Overly High Prices: While quality comes at a price, avoid services that charge exorbitant fees without clear justifications. Don't assume that a high price is a guarantee of quality. No Satisfaction Guarantee: Services that don't offer any form of satisfaction guarantee should be approached with caution. A guarantee demonstrates the service's confidence in its quality. Unverified Reviews: Be wary of services with no or unverifiable customer reviews. Check sites like TrustPilot or Sitejabber to see real, independent customer reviews. Hidden Fees: Ensure there are no hidden fees or additional charges that might surprise you after you've committed to the service. 5. Resume review FAQs Hopefully, you've now got a pretty good idea of how you should go about getting help on your resume, but in case you've still got questions, let's answer a few more here. 5.1 How long does it take to receive feedback from a resume review service? That really depends. Turnaround times vary a lot by service. Basic reviews might provide feedback within a few days, while more comprehensive reviews can take a week or longer. If you pay more for one, you can usually get quicker results. On IGotAnOffer, you can usually book a resume review session for the next day. 5.2 Are online resume review services as effective as in-person services? In our experience, yes. Online services provide access to experienced professionals who can offer valuable insights and feedback remotely. In-person services work for some people, particularly older candidates, but it naturally is more time-consuming for everyone involved and you end up paying for other costs such as room rental, transport time, etc. 5.3 Do resume review services guarantee job placement or interviews? No resume review services can truly guarantee job offers or interviews. While they can enhance your resume's quality, job success depends on various factors, such as your skills, experience, and the job market. Be cautious of services that make unrealistic guarantees. That said, using a good resume review service should result in a lot more interview invitations. When testing the best resume writing services, I considered each service's ease of use, price, customizations and packages available and more. In addition to my own review of each service, I enlisted Forbes recruiters to review and help stack rank each service to ensure our testing was accurately rated. Packages include Standard, Professional and Premium—and you can opt for a LinkedIn profile makeover and a 30-minute call with a professional reviewer. Its base package doesn't come with an interview guarantee, but at the same time, it's one of the most affordable options I tested. You begin by filling out a questionnaire that covers your background and what you're seeking in your next role. You'll be asked to provide a few job listings you're interested in during this process; the assigned resume writer tailors the resumes to fit these roles. From there, you're assigned a writer and receive a first draft in four business days. The resume I received looks clean with clear section titles and breaks.Resumeble The resume I received looked neat and highlighted sections with a soft green section break. While that did give the resume a splash of color, according to recruiters I spoke with, color isn't necessary on a resume, and if it's used too much, it can be distracting. Dates, job titles and company names were bolded to easily locate them on the page, and I felt the job duties and accomplishments were clean and easy to read. The most expansive duties and accomplishments were listed under my most recent job, which is exactly what you want for a resume. Of all the resume writing services I tested, the recruiters and I felt Resumeable highlighted my skills and work experience the best. I appreciated how the writer smartly condensed my contract work history (which includes multiple 6-month contract stints) into what I felt was a more readable format. Our recruiters were less enthused about this and felt that the paragraphs should have been briefer. My resume writer specifically asked for context during that time to ensure she understood my duties and accomplishments. Of all the resume writing services I tried, ResumeSpice was the only one that dove this deeply into my background, and it's those little details that make it apparent the service was built by actual recruiters. ResumeSpice kept a clean, black-and-white format for the resume I received.ResumeSpice Turnaround time proved to be a little longer than the advertised two days, but it was worth the wait. The resume looked clean and professional, with clear-cut bullet points for my job duties as well as a select accomplishments section for all applicable roles. This resume doesn't look fancy—in fact it's very simple with plain black-and-white text. But remember that so long as a resume looks clean and showcases your talents with experience, core competencies, education and technical skills sections, that's all you need—and ResumeSpice does exactly this. When I conferred with the Forbes recruiting team, they also felt the bullet points were easy to read, and they appreciated the selected achievements were below job duties. But when reviewing the final resume, the link atop the page that should have gone to my LinkedIn profile page was broken—and that was a big issue for me. Something else that I didn't like about ResumeSpice: The writer highlighted my contract roles as contract in parenthesis. I have experienced times when another candidate was chosen over me at the final round of the hiring process because my roles were freelance or contract instead of full-time. While it's still considered experience, sometimes a company may choose a full-time candidate over a contractor because full-time positions can be considered better experience. You can ask to remove this language, but remember that you only get two rounds of revisions, so make sure you thank you contact. And when I ran it through ATS tracking software, this resume scored 57 and 74 out of 100, both of which are slightly less than Resumeble's score. You can add on extras, including a cover letter (\$199), a LinkedIn profile update (\$199), interview prep (\$179) and a professional bio (\$199) for websites, social media and more. You can also add a thank you letter (\$129). The service ranges from a basic package (like the one I tested), to working with a personal US-based recruiter that costs \$1,149 per month. The basic package includes a resume without a cover letter, but other tiers offer career consulting and a LinkedIn profile update. It's also worth noting that the 60-day interview guarantee is only available in the Professional and Personal Recruiter packages. (The other services I tested, the process here is fairly straightforward, albeit a little time-consuming. After completing the questionnaire, it takes a couple of days to assign a writer, and another couple of days to receive your first draft. After your first one, you get two more resume revisions. The resume I received was by far the most comprehensive, and contained sections like "High-Impact Contributions," and, "Writing and Edition Excellence," to showcase my skills. I particularly liked how it separated out the quantitative accomplishments to showcase what I could bring to my hypothetical next role. I wasn't a fan of TopStack's resume header: TopStack There were a few features that confused me, including seemingly random bolded words (which presumably corresponded to relevant keywords) and the way the core competencies section didn't have a section head. Our recruiters felt that the writing and excellence section could have been eliminated and the high-impact contributions folded into the odds are, but if you're a C-Suite executive, having these details might make or break your candidacy. Everything was bulleted in easy-to-read segments. There were some drawbacks. I let the resume writer choose the template, and she used one with icons for my contact information. To be blunt, the icons look quite dated—and use of blue highlighting made it feel archaic. In general, I would have liked to have seen a cleaner resume. But overall, it's a good resume if you need to impress other high-level hiring managers. When I scored it in ATS-optimization software, it only earned 50 out of 100 on both tests, but again, you should plan to consider human readership here, not any ATS bots. Odds are if you're going for these leadership roles, a real human will be interviewing these resumes, not putting them through ATS software. It's also hard to ignore the option to have a personal recruiter on your team—if you can afford it. Like many other services on this list, you enter your information into a questionnaire and provide links to some roles that interest you. Once you get your resume back, you can revise it twice.TopResume limited the use of color to a minimum.TopResume The resume I received had a lot of text on it, and that was a problem for my ATS scanner, which scored it 49 and 75 out of 100. That's not to say it's a bad resume; in fact, it dives deep into my career details to convey my quantitative successes, one of the most important things you should be doing on your resume. "Sections are called out nicely," our recruitment team shared with me, noting how the writer used a combination of paragraphs and bullet points. "You usually want to see more numbers and accomplishments, like what was the revenue streams and what are the numbers, especially under a candidate's most recent role," one recruiter told me. I would have liked to have seen the resume service fold in the quantitative accomplishments in with my work history, but that's personal preference. I also appreciated how the resume writer combined my Dotdash Meredith experience into one for easy readability. The Forbes recruiting team also called out that TopResume added really valuable details in the Education section of my resume, such as honor societies I was involved in during college along with my degree; they felt that provided more insight than other resumes we tested. You work at your own pace (and entirely on your own) to create a resume. Sign up for an account through Indeed.com, and it takes you through each step resume writing process, asking you to fill in your work history and job duties. One unique feature is you can opt to have AI rewrite your resume for you, or you can see what others in your industry have written and "paste" those tasks into your job duties. To test this option, I ran the software twice: once, I used my old resume and uploaded the original language to the template; and the second time, I used Resume.com's AI. The resume with my original language looked very, very condensed and cluttered, with lots of black text on the white page that recruiters didn't like. However, the AI resume was better reviewed by recruiters for its clean, easy-to-read bullets, but it wasn't without its flaws. At one point, the software revealed its AI underpinnings by claiming a company called Dotdash was in Meredith, New Hampshire. (Dotdash Meredith, where I actually worked, is based in New York City.) If you use this software, make sure you edit it—it's far from perfect. The AI also didn't highlight any of my quantitative accomplishments, which as a mid-level career editor, I found problematic.Note the Meredith, New Hampshire in one of the job listings.Resume.com Still, there were some features that stood out: For one, it limited my resume to a single page. For reference, you can go to two pages so long as you take up at least one-third of the second page. It also did a great job of keeping the information segregated, so if you were looking for all skills—not just core competencies and technical skills—you could find them all in one place. Our Forbes recruiters really liked this build, since the rest of the resumes separated skills out into the aforementioned categories. If you want a resume without spending anything, you can use this resume service. I would recommend it for an entry-level career person looking for a first or second role. However, I strongly recommend against using this service if you're mid-level professional or higher, because it won't be able to do your skills and accomplishments the justice needed to wow a recruiter. When I ran both resumes through ATS software, the AI resume scored 42 and 63 the one written by me scored a 49 and 63 out of 100. How We Tested The Best Resume Writing Services When choosing the best resume writing services, we took a few features into account: Timeline: We timed how quickly each resume writing service produced a first and final draft of a resume. Process: We considered whether you filled out a questionnaire or spoke with someone on the phone regarding work history. We also considered how many revisions a resume writing service offered. Formatting and readability: A good format can help your resume stand out by breaking down your work history into easy-to-read sections, including work experience, skills and more. We considered how each resume conveyed this information, and whether it felt like too many words on a page. Panel testing: To ensure a fair, unbiased review, we blind panel tested them. In addition to my own stack rankings, two of our Forbes reviewers as well as executive editor Dave Johnson reviewed and ranked each resume. They shared with me what they liked about each one and what could be improved about each one. They dove deep, calling out typos and commenting on the overall formatting, use of bullet points and more. This panel testing helped cement the top picks in their current categories as well as name our best resume writing service overall: Resumeable. ATS Software Compatibility: We ran each resume through a several ATS tracking systems to make sure they would read well when reviewed by recruiting departments in the real world. I ran each resume through resumeworded and MyPerfectResume to receive scores for how well it can pass these programs, as each ATS resume review software is different. Both software gave me results that were based on scores out of 100. Features: Some resume writing services offered customized bundle packages, while others only offered a resume or a resume and cover letter. It has a great customizable package and the resume it produced felt easy to read and conveyed my work history and skills quickly to Forbes recruiters. It's truly your opportunity to market your skills, experience and education in a clear and concise manner to that potential employer." Sometimes, you may miss a skill or a feature on your resume, and a resume writing service can help maximize your chances of scoring an interview. If you're not sure whether you're highlighting your skills for a potential employer, it can be worth the investment. Some services also offer more than just resume writing, and can include a cover letter. "Always check testimonials and make sure the company is legitimate. Anyone can create a website and upload fake testimonials. LinkedIn testimonials are ideal because you can review the profiles of the people who wrote them," she says. If you're considering a company, make sure the company accepts certain types of payments, too. Make sure you avoid, "Any company requiring any large payments up-front, especially through a cash app or Zelle. Legitimate companies will accept credit cards or PayPal Goods and Services so you can get a refund if the services end up being dissatisfactory or a scam," Yeko adds.How Important Is A Cover Letter?>How Important Is A Cover Letter?According to Yeko, it depends. A strong cover letter, "can be very valuable if the hiring manager or recruiter actually reads it because it can explain why your experience and education aligns well with the job," she says, but truly "depends on the company and the job." For example, during her tenure at Penske Media Corporation, she, "hired dozens of writers. Those jobs definitely required cover letters because people were writing for a living." For other companies, it may not be as important. In general, she recommends writing a cover letter, "when the application requires one or when I really want to." If you're not sure how to write a cover letter, many of the services I tested offer a cover letter option to help you submit a strong application.
