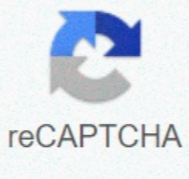

Everywhere. At the same time. (Some stage managers take this to granted.) The dramaturgos for several generations now fought with the limitations of time on stage. They rolled with him, ran back, stopped completely and it turned it circular. But the curtain still rises (if only metaphorically) at the end. The constellations of Nick Payne lead the clumsy paradoxes of time. While the script speaks the most conventional of love stories - dating, conflict, complacency, death - the drama presents the plateau with a multiplicity of stuttering for bifurcation paths. The Classical Day tragedy usually leaves us with the certainty of an end. Constellations lead us to a point that seems to be definitive, but provides a myriad of other possibilities. The pace of the signs and answers of the plot are well walked; your physics and Metaphysics never become tedious. Believe me, there is no such thing in Peterborough's Players. " There are no coincidence that Gus Kalkkonen did not only direct the actors, but also projected the set with a careful collaboration with John Eckert, the lighting designer. Since the beginning, the pair is determined to make a sparkling spectacle of constellations. And they have success. The production is a sound and light and action choreography - a thymical dance spy - in a compact space. The challenge for Marianne (Bridget Beirne) and Roland (Sean Patrick Hopkins) is to play different scenarios from your relationship yet maintain a character consistency throughout the fragmentation. [1] The game received positive christics from the chronicians and subsequently transferred to the york theater duke in the West End in November 2012. [2] The reviewer for The Guardian wrote "for all his provocation Razzle-Dazzle, but is the human warmth of writing and act that guarantees the piece never slides in tricksiness. " [3] In November 2012 Constellations was named the winner of the best piece category at the Evening Standard Awards Theater, making the 29-year-old Payne the youngest winner of the family.
