How much do security guards make uk

As a Disney security guard, you are responsible for assessing and preventing threats to visiting patrons and Disney's private property. The Walt Disney Company has several locations around the globe that require security guards, including the Disneyland campus in Anaheim, California, and the Disney World campus in Orlando, Florida. Regardless of which Disney location you choose for employment, there is a specific protocol required by each state, though it is quite similar from state to state. The U.S. maintains embassies around the globe as part of its diplomatic outreach to other nations. Since December, 1948, the U.S. Marine Corps has worked to safeguard many of the nation's embassies, providing highly trained troops to the State Department. Marine Security Guards, or MSGs, are overseen by the State Department's director of diplomatic security. Before a Marine heads to security guard duty, though, he must successfully pass a course of instruction at the Marine Corps security-guard school. The Marine security guard program began its life with 83 trained MSGs making up its original cadre. According to the State Department, there are now more than 1,300 Marine security guards deployed in over 148 MSG detachments worldwide. The primary mission of MSGs is to provide internal security services at U.S. diplomatic and consular facilities abroad. As part of their mission, Marine security guards are also tasked with providing protection for U.S. citizens and property located within overseas diplomatic facilities. Marine security guard is a volunteer special tour of duty within the Marine Corps, and selection standards are very high. Marines who successfully apply for MSG duty are sent to the Marine security guard school in Quantico, Virginia. The Marine Corps trains about 450 MSGs annually, though Congress has authorized an increase in their number to more fully staff diplomatic facilities. MSG school is difficult, though, and the attrition rate exceeds 25 percent over the seven-week training course. Marine security guard training itself is comprehensive and includes instruction from the State Department on topics such as the function of diplomatic missions. MSGs also receive specialized training in various firearms, defensive tactics, first aid, fire response and improvised explosive detection. While at MSG school, a Marine is closely evaluated by instructors, based on dedication to training and response to counseling, which is frequent. MSG school instructors are hand-selected from among the most successful Marine security guard detachment commanders. MSG duty is open to male and female Marines meeting rigorous evaluation standards. If you're a Marine sergeant E-5 and below and are married, you're ineligible for MSG duty. MSG detachment commanders hold the rank of staff sergeant E-6 and above and they can be married and also have children. Marine sergeants and below receive MSG orders lasting 36 months; they serve at three posts for 12 months each. MSG staff sergeants and above serve at two posts for 18 months each. However, personal security guards and bodyguards serve all kinds of people, not just celebrities or characters in movies; and their responsibilities expand beyond society's image of looking large and tough. The reality is far from what's shown in movies; it's a job that requires dedication and long hours. Personal security salaries vary widely but tend to average around \$26,000. Private or personal security jobs provide protection for people, households or facilities. The guards don't have the rights or powers that a police officer might, but they can still deny entry or detain intruders until law enforcement is called. Their job is to protect access to the people or property they've been hired to guard. The work that they do depends entirely on the personal details involved, but most jobs will require the following skill sets: Observation: Personal security guards need to pay attention to their surroundings and who is attempting to access the area they're involved with. Often security jobs require patrolling an area to make sure it's free of threats, along with checking doors and access points to ensure they remain secure. The job itself requires a high level of vigilance. Communication: Unfortunately, in many situations where personal bodyguards are stationed, the people they're working to protect aren't in great situations. A personal security guard needs to be able to stay calm and communicate valuable information to individuals that may get angry or even violent when they are denied access. They're ultimately responsible for keeping the situation or confrontation calm. Additional skills required of a personal security guard include: Decision making: A personal security guard needs to be able to make snap decisions. Is this person a danger? Should this individual be allowed to enter the property? If they are a threat, what's the best way to deescalate the situation? Bodyguards need to be able to make a rapid decision with good judgment and stick with it. Physical Strength: Not all personal security guards need to be physically intimidating, but depending on the situation, a guard may need to restrain or otherwise physically interrupt an attack or assault from the outside. In these cases, the guard needs to be not only physically strong enough, but well-trained so that they don't hurt any individuals involved. Certification: Many states now require personal bodyguards to complete a certification process to ensure they will work to solve problems and de-escalate potentially dangerous situations. Salary for a personal security guard will vary wildly depending on the situation, their experience and regional location. For example, a bodyguard hired to protect a minor celebrity in California will have an entirely different salary than a personal security guard hired to watch over the home of an individual with a restraining order against a violent ex in Ohio. Again, any mention of the career makes people think about glamour and bright lights, but in reality, a security guard serves their client, whatever their needs might be. According to Salary.com, the average annual salary for a private security guard is \$26,910. Glassdoor estimates the average annual salary at \$26,540, which is surprisingly close. These are rough estimates; many personal security guards will find their hours vary based on the client's schedule, and they may be paid daily rather than at a salary rate. A security guard's salary will increase as they gain years of experience, pass training courses and obtain certifications, and build a portfolio of satisfied clients who can offer references. While they may never end up working as a bodyguard to the rich and famous, their work is still valuable and incredibly important to their client. "Current technology can use face-recognition to identify shoplifters. "Shoplifting clues include over-sized jackets, overly large purses, and looking around a lot while shopping."
